OVERVIEW

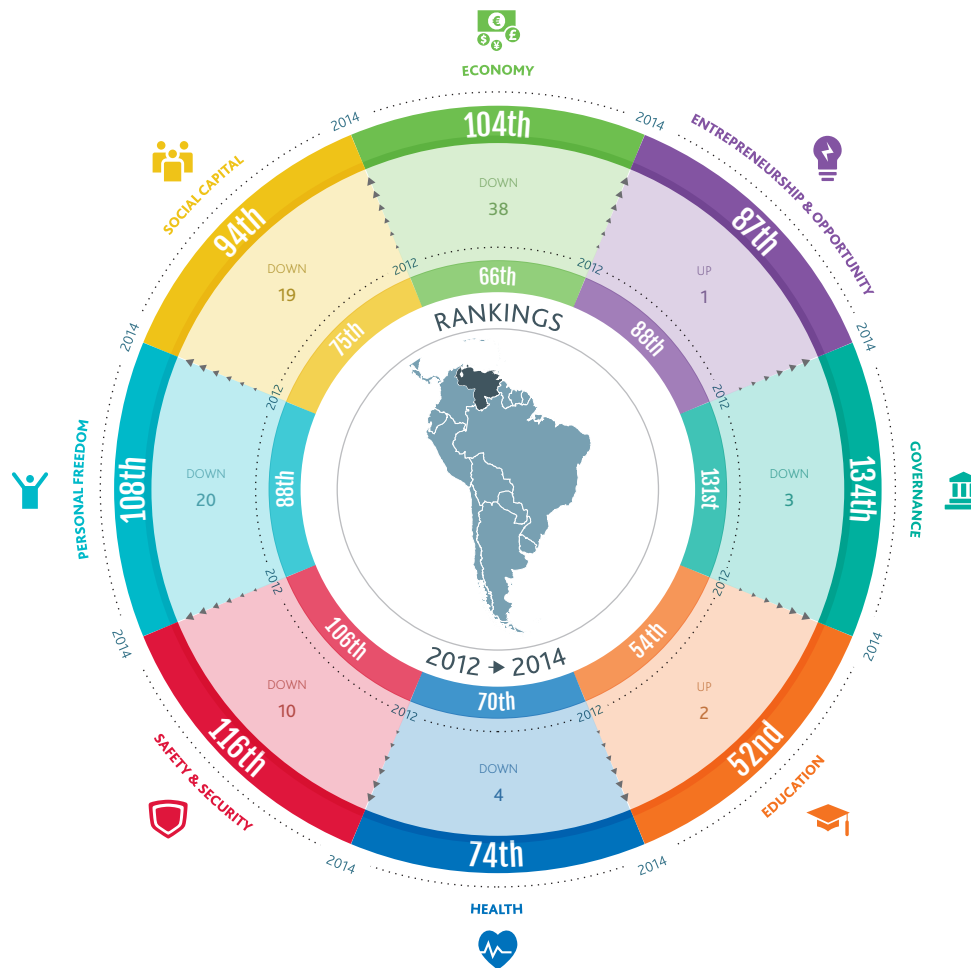
The Prosperity Index is a unique and robust assessment of global wealth and wellbeing, benchmarking 142 countries in eight distinct categories.

The Index is comprised of 89 individual indicators and has six consecutive years of comparable data.

Venezuela ranks 100th globally in the 2014 Prosperity index, having fallen 22 places since last year.

Venezuela's best performance is in the Education sub-index, where it ranks 52nd in 2014.

Venezuela's lowest rank is in the Governance sub-index, where it ranks 134th in 2014.
